- Lynn Schlossman moved to accept the minutes from last meeting and the motion was seconded. **Approved**

- Betty moved to approve the minutes from last meeting. **Approved**

-Jennifer Ryan gave the Treasurer's report. We have a total of \$1236.86 in the PAC account after a \$400 check was written to the IRS to finalize our non-profit status. Neisha moved to accept the budget and to hold a See's Candy fundraiser in the Spring. **Approved**

- The GLOW Dance will be at GV on December 10th from 7pm to 11pm. We need volunteers!

-Gail Pinsker gave an update on the Solar Initiative getting started at ten schools in the Hart District. The project will save approximately \$20 million over the next 20 years. Installation at GV is slated to begin in late February and will take about 70 days to complete. Somas, the company doing the installation, has also granted \$50,000 to the district for replacement of trees lost during construction.

-Ann McCann gave a report on the library. There is a newsletter she distributes with information about clubs and other library activities. Currently, Friends of the Library are sponsoring a clothing drive to benefit the Santa Clarita Valley Homeless Shelter.

-Eran Zeevi gave a presentation about GV's Career Tech program. Representatives from the Navy and Marine Corps were on hand to demonstrate the support they give Golden Valley, and to share information about how the armed services can benefit GV students who are interested. The ROP program provides opportunities for 11th and 12th grade students to attend classes in many different possible career areas. Currently, GV offers two career pathway options, Culinary Arts and Arts/Media Entertainment, that partner with College of the Canyons to offer classes in those areas for college credit. Many other career classes are offered through ROP. All seniors must take either AP, ROP, or career exploration classes so that after graduation they have a plan for what path they are interested in.

-The DAC and PCC Reports both had solar project information, as well as some discussion on the 2012 Summer School to be held at GV starting July 2nd. The session will run 5 weeks and will offer mostly credit recovery classes. Health and Art will be offered as enrichment courses.
