- Laura Beers moved to accept the agenda and the motion was seconded **Approved**
- Ami moved to approve the minutes from last meeting **Approved**
- Treasurer Report- Jennifer Ryan and Ami Gonzales  
Balance of \$2361.08 in our PAC account.
- Lynn moved to spend \$100 on Carl's Jr coupon books to raise money for ASB **Approved**
- The DAC meeting had information on the upcoming solar project, Governor Brown's visit, and the volunteer recognition dinner to be held Wednesday, April 27th- Karla Lund
- Gail Pinkser, Community Liaison for Hart District, gave a presentation on the solar project, to begin construction in the upcoming year. This project will save \$400,000 in the first year, with a projected savings of \$25 million over the next 20 years. Discussion centered on the esthetics of the project and how it would affect the look of our school, against the significant financial savings, along with the added benefit of providing much-needed shade for our students.
- Joel Nelson updated us on the plans for Graduation, and Grad Night. Graduation will be at College of the Canyons on Monday, 5/23<sup>rd</sup>, at 7:00pm.
- Mark Chester gave an overview of our PE department, introduced the teachers, and talked about some possible new choices to satisfy the PE requirement for 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders. These options will interest many students and get them more involved in being physically active and preparing for state PE testing.
- Mike Watts gave a presentation about the Golden Valley JROTC program. This program builds strong leadership skills and promotes citizenship, respect and responsibility. It counts as PE and science credit, and is not a commitment to join the military upon graduation.
- Laura Beers gave an overview of the restructured ASB for next year, and let us know how creative and active these students are in running for office and planning the many activities at GV every year. One project they are working on is a rebranding of the GV logo. This new logo and line of clothing choices will allow all the spirit shirts, uniforms and other uses of our logo to have a cohesive look, and will be instantly recognizable as belonging to Golden Valley. There will be many options to use this new logo, and ways to make it fit each sport. This logo will be ours alone, to use as we see fit, with no copyright infringement and can be worn with pride. Go Grizzlies!
- Robert Fisher talked about our athletic department and updated us on the success of our spring athletic teams. GV is becoming a force to be reckoned with against other schools in the valley. Efforts are being made to keep the costs associated with participating in athletics as low as possible, but it is encouraged to support the teams, to pay the costs and keep the door open for all to participate.
- Ami expressed the need for help with the STAR testing finishing up this week. Proctors are needed to help monitor exams, and to collect and distribute materials every day.
- Lizzie Ayala thanked us for our \$75 contribution to her tuition to the summer program in Georgetown. She is \$1900 away from meeting her goal, due May 27<sup>th</sup>. She is working on a fundraiser at Chilli's this month.
- Mr. Frias reported on Governor Brown's visit. The financial picture is grim, there is little money to support programs. Parents continued support is necessary for our students to have their opportunities.
